<u>WHERE</u>: Beuscher State Park – <u>LAKEVIEW</u> Camping Area. <u>WHEN</u>: Friday, April 12<sup>th</sup> – Sunday, April 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024

<u>COST</u>: <u>\$30 for both nights</u>. (Campsite's only).

Tent or vehicle camping only. (No RV's or campers in Lakeview Area)

CAMPSITES: #41-#60 each site has a picnic table, fire pit, and water hook up. Sites #56, #57, #58, #59, & #60 are walk-up sites (no driving to or parking at site)
