## **CTANA Task force for RFATX and Insurance concerns**

The Task Force committee has done research regarding the insurance claim regarding the broken window and claim made at Region. The Board at RFATX has made it clear- they have not asked for payment and will not accept any funds from NA to reimburse them.

In making clarity of a potential precedence - They will only ask for funds in damages because of intentional damages or negligence.

Please see my report and pertinent documents from the RFATX Board attached.

#### **Questions for clarification**

- 1. Insurance The vote for liability insurance carried down the line to Region was inspired by Regions in California having the same coverage and it was working well for them. The Region wanted to be sure we were covered for instances of damages, injuries, and catastrophic events. They are registered as the insured in a 5013c Capacity. It was voted on about 8-10 years ago.
  - A. It is important to note that they do cover groups listed on the BMLT-Basic Meeting List Toolbox. Please research your home group and make sure it is listed.
  - B. You can then go onto the website- <a href="https://tbrna.org/insurance-information">https://tbrna.org/insurance-information</a>

And fill out a request for a COI (Certificate of Insurance) for your homegroup to keep in your files. Please note special events are not covered.

- C. In this current question about the Window replacement, it was brought to Region, and they contacted their insurance broker for guidance- the Broker advised that the main risk of small claims right now is having the policy terminated. So, they are proposing to pay for it to avoid such a situation

Regarding item 5, RFATX will continue the current practice of communicating directly with each individual group.

Everyone is encouraged to practice personal responsibility, just like they would in any meeting space. No one is under surveillance at RFATX. Board Members often wear multiple hats, and any immediate action would only happen in the most serious situations.

Myron was kind enough to lend me a binder with every NA Newsletter from 1997. All copies have been scanned and added to the Newsletter Google Drive. I have gotten a lot of ideas from the previous newsletter and would like to incorporate them into the new newsletter. The 1997 Newsletter had a column for personal stories and a column on the "step of the month." I have asked Holly and Tony G to write an article for the personal story's column, and Ry Z and to write on step 7. In the future, I will put a disclaimer in the newsletter instructing anyone who wants to write for either of those columns to email the newsletter sub-subcommittee. However, if less



than 3 people for each category email by the week before Subcommittee meetings, I'll ask around and see if folks I know are willing to write for those columns as I've done this month.

One of the newsletter feedback responses was on possibly changing anniversaries from the current month to the previous month. I see the reasoning for this - no fronts and am doing some research. I responded saying I would confer with PR, but I don't think we can, as I'm worried it would violate tradition 6. I wanted to ask for confirmation from more experienced members, so if y'all could share your knowledge on this, that would be great.

If y'all could encourage people to make submissions to the reflections category specifically, that would be great. Reminder: Topic of the month is the newcomer is the most important person at any meeting because we can only keep what we have be giving it away. It is requested that submissions be around 400 WORDS (not characters) or fewer. However, if the word count goes a little over that, that is okay.

I have been thinking on how to handle the cutoff of submissions, which will occur this Wednesday at 11:59 PM. I think it would be easier for me to just edit the existing survey (changing the month from July-August to August-September and modifying the topic of the month). Then, I can redirect the responses to a new spreadsheet. This way, we will not have to upload a new link, and I won't have to spend a ton of time creating a whole new survey. Let me know what you think about that.

I am starting to work on putting the newsletter together, drawing inspiration from the 1997 newsletter. I will send a draft to this email on Friday. If y'all could approve it ASAP once that happens, then we can publish it on Sunday, July 13th.
